Letter from the Trustee

Greetings!

I am honored to write this Township newsletter article as your newly elected Trustee.

Though this role is new to me, I am obviously not new to Sycamore Township. After almost 41 years of working for the Township and loving every day of it, I made the decision this past summer to change directions and run for Trustee. I would like to thank you for your support and tell you that I am very humbled to know that my years of service are appreciated. Your confidence in me shows that you think I have done a good job for our community, and I am honored to have been elected to this position.



I want to thank our Township staff, which, in my opinion, is second to none. We are fortunate to have very capable and dedicated employees in all departments of the Township. I would also like to thank Mr. Weidman and Ms. Schwegmann for their help as I transition into this new role as an elected official. I am confident that we will be a very strong team for the Township and you, our residents.

First on our agenda as a Board was to hire a new Township Administrator. These projects include the construction of additional sidewalks as we strive to make the Township a more walkable community and the rehabilitation of Kenwood Road from the intersection of Montgomery Road northward to the City of Blue Ash Corp line. We are also very excited to report that we are nearing the end of the design and engineering phase of a Veterans Memorial that is going to be built in Bechtold Park; there will be a lot more information on this to come.

Good weather means the return of some of our most in-demand residential services, such as our Monthly Brush Chipping Program, Document Shredding Day, and, most popular of all, the North and South Trash Bash. Our parks will also be busy with baseball games, soccer games, shelter rentals, and special events, including Music In The Park and the ever-popular Festival in Sycamore. This year's Festival will feature Red Hot Chili Peppers and Pearl Jam tribute bands on Friday night and the return of Jefferson Starship on Saturday night. This is a family-friendly event, so bring the kids to enjoy "Rides for \$5". Check the events calendar for all Township activities throughout the year including my favorite The National Day of Prayer on Thursday May 2nd at 12:00 noon in front of the Township Administration Building.

I look forward to seeing everyone out and about throughout the Township during the warm weather months, and on behalf of my fellow Trustees Tom Weidman and Tracy Schwegmann and Fiscal Officer Jon Deters, I want to thank you for your support of the Township and wish you a healthy and safe year.

Sycamore Township Fire Department strives every day to make Sycamore Township a safe place to live and work. As our responses increase, we still make time to continue to offer professional education to our residents and businesses. Last year, the fire department responded to 5,030 runs, an average of 14 runs per day.

The Sycamore Township Fire Department has offered First Aid and CPR classes for some time. We are excited to announce that we are offering a new class called AVERT, which stands for Active Violence Emergency Response Training. This class is geared toward Township businesses, retail shops, schools, and churches. While other programs focus solely on active shooters or Stop the Bleed, AVERT goes beyond by combining both important topics into one comprehensive training program. AVERT training incorporates live scenario exercises and hands-on practice to give people tools for how to respond. With AVERT, you will learn how to recognize warning signs using situational awareness, decide whether to escape, evade, or attack, apply critical stop-the-bleeding techniques, and respond quickly and confidently in an emergency. The cost per certification is \$10.00.

Police and Crime Prevention

Quite often, during discussions with residents, we are made aware of criminal incidents and/or suspicious activity that have not been reported to the Sheriff's Office at the time they occurred. We're usually given one of three reasons: someone didn't want to bother us with something that didn't seem very important or serious; a crime victim didn't feel that there was anything that could be done, so they didn't see the need for a report; or someone was worried about tying up a deputy while a more serious offense was occurring. I would like to address each of these concerns.

First, our Deputies are on duty in Sycamore Township 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. We are happy to respond anywhere, anytime. You can ask for a Deputy to come to your location, or you can come to us. Sheriff's District 3 is at 8871 Weekly Lane, and our Sycamore Township Substation is at 8540 Kenwood Road (just to the right of the fire department entrance). Our non-emergency dispatch number is 513-825-2280. You can also ask for a Deputy to call you if you have a quick question or if you feel your issue could be handled over the phone. Quite simply, no matter what the problem, we're here to help, and we don't want anyone to feel we are bothered by their call for service.

Second, while it is true that many low-level property crimes (criminal mischief, criminal damaging, car break-ins, etc.) are difficult to solve, it is imperative that the Sheriff's Office be made aware of all of these offenses. Our intelligence analysts constantly study calls for service, offense reports, and intelligence reports generated by Deputies in the field. They use the information from those sources to help us understand how to best deploy Deputies in Sycamore Township. If we don't have a clear picture of what's actually occurring, we can't do this in the most effective manner. The same is true with suspicious activity. The vague piece of information you may have (a vehicle description without a license plate or the general physical description of a person) may be the missing piece of a puzzle for a Deputy on the street, a detective, or an intelligence analyst.

Finally, the Hamilton County Communications Center, which handles all of our calls and dispatches our deputies, prioritizes all calls for service before dispatching a Deputy. Calls of a serious nature (crimes in progress, automobile crashes with injuries, etc.) will always be dispatched prior to those not requiring an immediate response. Additionally, if a high-priority incident were to occur while a deputy was on a routine call, that deputy would immediately be rerouted to the more serious incident. You should never feel that your call to us would prevent us from responding in a timely manner to a more serious call.

Please remember that we're always here and happy to help with any issue you may have. The more information we have from you, the better we're able to patrol Sycamore Township... no crime is too insignificant to report. Your routine calls for service will never prevent or delay us from responding to someone who is in immediate need of assistance.

Oil-based paint, household chemicals, and pesticides will be accepted at the SOUTH TRASH BASH ONLY. Latex paint and yard waste, including brush and leaves, will not be accepted. Construction Ahead!

It is springtime, and that means construction season is right around the corner. The Township has a busy construction year planned! As part of our goal to make Sycamore Township a more walkable community, we have several sidewalk projects planned. You'll see sidewalks being constructed on Euclid Avenue, Finley Lane, Baen Road and Deerfield Road, as well as sidewalk repairs in the Windfield Subdivision.

Significant improvements to Kenwood Road between Montgomery Road and the Blue Ash Corp. Line are planned, including resurfacing of the roadway, new pavement marking, replacement of sidewalks, curb repairs, new street signage, crosswalks, curb ramps, and more. The Township's annual Road Program will be back with pavement restoration and curb repair on various streets in our neighborhoods. Visit our website later this spring to check if your street is included.

You'll also notice improvements to our parks as we remove the last of the old picnic shelters at Bechtold Park and construct a new shelter #4 near the nature trail. Plans are also underway to install new playground equipment at Bob Meyer Park near Sturbridge subdivision.
