After a long Winter, the flowers and trees are blooming and Spring is finally here. The Township is providing a couple of services that will help you with your "Spring Cleaning". While the Township used salt to clear the roads of snow this past winter, the County used "grit" which is the black substance that is seen on County roads and unfortunately has been tracked onto our Township roads, creating a serious mess in many of our neighborhoods. Starting in the month of April, the Trustees have contracted with an outside company to run street sweepers on every Township road (except those under re-construction). They will continue the process until all roads are completed. We will also be holding one of our two always popular "Trash Bash" weekends with the first one being at Bechtold Park from Friday May 15th through Sunday, May 17th.

In a follow up from our wind storm in the Fall and ice storm in the Winter, I wanted to inform you that we have had multiple meetings with Duke to discuss how the restoration of power was executed for our residents during these two events, and how Duke's lack of communication with the Township put some of our residents in extraordinary situations. Duke has acknowledged that because of the magnitude of the storms, their communication with our Township emergency personnel was not as good as it should have been. Duke has taken corrective action in response to the concerns we expressed and set up an email Storm Distribution List with Chief Jetter and the Trustees on it to communicate through email or Blackberries and provide advance notice of all storms that are eminent, and what precautions Duke is taking to guarantee minimal outages from the storms. If there are any residents with special medical needs, Duke has also developed an Energy Life Support Program which will allow Duke to target power restoration to the medically needy in our community. If there are any residents that do not have access to the web, feel free to contact the Township and we would be happy to fill out the form for you and get you registered.

Your Trustees are committed to expanding our already great park facilities in the Township, and we hope you will mark your calendars for what we think will be a park dedication like no other. On

Saturday, August 22nd, we will be dedicating our newest park on Deerfield Road that encompasses 18 acres. It will include a Class A lighted baseball facility, 3 soccer fields, walking track and playground area. The park will also house our newest. Fire Station, and

VIAL OF LIFE

As the weather is springing forward the Fire Department wants to provide you with the best possible care should you experience a medical emergency. One way for us to do that is to supply you with a Vial of Life. This easy to use plastic tube contains forms for you to fill out. You simply answer the questions on the forms and put the Vial of Life in the top shelf of your refrigerator door. A magnet that comes with the Vial is placed on the outside of your refrigerator door. If you have

a medical emergency the EMS crew will then have immediate access to your emergency contact phone numbers, doctor's name, number and prescription information.


If you don't currently have a Vial of Life, please call the **Fire Department at 792-8565** and we will be happy to deliver one to you. If you need new forms for your Vial you can either access them by going to our website at **www.sycamoretownship.org** and click on departments, then on Fire & EMS, then on public information. At the bottom of the paragraph about the Vial of Life you will find a link that will enable you to print the forms. If you don't have access to the internet you are welcome to call the Fire Department and we will make sure you

Another key safety point for spring is to make sure that all combustible materials such as gas cans, oil and oil rags are sealed and hung to air dry so that these volatile materials are safely stored.

Many residents have recently observed the Fire Department training in various locations throughout the Township. State law requires all personnel to maintain CEU's and be trained for recertification. You may also see department members in your neighborhood this spring checking and flushing hydrants. In order to maintain a Class 2 ISO insurance rating we must provide hydrant servicing and log in required hours for training in both EMS & fire exercises. Enjoy the spring!



COMPOST GIVE-AWAY

The Township will again provide free compost and wood chips on Saturday, May 9, from 8:00 am until 4:00 pm. The material may be picked up at the Township's compost site adjacent to Hartzell United Methodist Church at 8999 Applewood Drive.

Maintenance personnel will be on hand to assist you in loading the material. There is an abundant supply of both compost and wood chips so come early and come often. No rain date has been set at this time.

TRASH BASH

To better serve the residents of Sycamore Township, the schedule of the 2009 Trash Bash will be one event in the spring and one event in the fall, as last year. Sycamore Township residents are welcome to take advantage of both events. The dates for the south Trash Bash at Bechtold Park. 4312 Sycamore Road, 45236, are scheduled for Friday, May 15th through Sunday, May 17th. The dates for the north Trash Bash at the North Sycamore Recreational Facility, 7841 School Road, 45241, are scheduled for Friday, September 18th through Sunday, September 20th. The Trash Bash hours of operation shall be from noon to 4 PM on Friday and Sunday and 8 AM to 4 PM on Saturday. The Sycamore Township maintenance staff will be on hand to offer assistance at both locations. Trash, junk, debris, tires, old construction materials, furniture, lawn mowers and appliances of all sorts will be accepted. Please note that paint,

chemicals, pesticides and yard waste including leaves, limbs and brush will not be accepted. Be prepared to show proof of residency. A valid driver's license or utility bill with your Sycamore Township address will be accepted.



Storm Damage Collection

When spring storms pass through Sycamore Township, you can rest assured that we are looking out for you! Storm damage collection is a service Sycamore Township has provided for many years through the maintenance department. The storm damage policy of the Township begins with the safety services department. Sycamore Township Fire Chief Jetter declares whether a "storm damage condition" has occurred. When a "storm damage condition" has been declared, residents must call 791-8447 within two working days after the **storm** to have the branches picked up at no charge. When you call, tell the office staff that you have storm damage, give them your name, address and phone number. It is not the policy of Sycamore Township to cover the whole Township street by street after a storm, but rather collecting from only the addresses reported to the office. The maintenance department will only pick up limbs and branches from the recent storm. Leaves, which are picked up during our annual fall "leaf season", will not be collected. Foundation plantings, old firewood, and tree and bush pruning will not be collected as storm damage. They can be disposed of through your trash collection or at our monthly brush chipping program held behind the Sycamore Township Maintenance Building, 8540 Kenwood Road, from 8 am until 4 pm on the first Saturday of each month.

SYCAMORE TOWNSHIP RESIDENTS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Congratulations Sycamore Township residents! In 2008, you recycled 646 tons of metal, glass, plastic, and paper. Sycamore

Township recycled 42 tons more in 2008 than in 2007! Residents saved resources, conserved energy, and reduced pollution by recycling.

The recycling efforts in Sycamore Township:

- Saved 5,440 trees
- Conserved enough energy to power 123 average homes for an entire year
- Avoided the need for 72 tons of iron ore, limestone, and coal
- Reduced greenhouse gases equivalent to removing 422 cars from the road for a year

Recycling reduces pollution so the air we breathe is cleaner, conserves natural resources so we will have them to use in the future, and decreases the energy needed to make new products. Recycling also boosts our local economy by creating 169,000 jobs and \$6 billion in annual wages just in the State of Ohio.

On average, each household in Sycamore Township recycled 156 pounds in 2008. That's 9.2 % of all the waste you generate. If you would like to see even more

material recycled in 2009, check out the list below to make sure you include all these materials in your recycling bin. Don't have a bin? Call 242-4600 if you have Rumpke or 771-4200 if you have CSI to request your bin today!
