We believe our 2' high curved stone structure approximately 20' long with a 2' x 2' pier at each end should not be defined as a fence or a wall acting like a fence.

The American Heritage dictionary defines a fence: "a structure serving as an enclosure, barrier or boundary". I believe the codes used in 10-7 Fences and Walls means the use of a wall as a fence. I therefore interpret our curved stone structure as not an enclosure, barrier or boundary. I interpret it as an integral part of our decorative landscaped area with the stone structure creating a focal point much like a grouping of large landscape rocks or a stone sculpture.

Summary: I believe the code is intending that front yards do not have enclosures, barriers or boundaries. I believe we do not have an enclosure, barrier or boundary and believe our structure should be permitted.
